

She is also a fellow of the Royal Society for the encouragement of Arts, Manufactures and Commerce. Chloe graduated in Furniture and Product Design from Nottingham Trent University in 1993 when she won the New Designer's 'Consumer Product Design' award.

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Chloe hopes her book will serve to help her fellow designers as well as students, clients and design enthusiasts and inspire how they work with purpose and encourage ripples of change in the industry.
